

WHAT I WANT TO DO:

Bring music to NUA. Our university suffers from a serious lack of it, given that we're an arts school with a brand new Electronic Music program. Specifically, I'd like to propose:

Collaborating with local music venues to organise student-led performances and events. Dead Wax, the Louis Marchesi Pub, the Holloway - there are so many excellent spots in Norwich that we could partner up with.

Investing in musical instruments for students to use. Pianos, for example, could be placed in an acting classroom or in the Duke Street foyer for easy student access. I would like to organize a series of collaborative murals created throughout the school year and presented across the university.

What better way to connect an artistic community than to create something together?

Establish mutually beneficial relationships with local businesses. Student discounts and events incentivise students to support local businesses; they get more customers, and we get things at a more affordable rate. Everyone wins.

Expand the Student Mentorship Program. I was a mentor for the Electronic Music course this past year, and as such I've got an insider view as to what improvements should be made: early introductions, consistent meeting times, clearer methods of communication...
